She is currently a mentor to a COA youth and has also worked on UUA campaign efforts last fall and with our own congregation's phonebank to Florida. An avid participant in our adult RE program, Judith led a book discussion in the Sacred Studies Program, and is a member

of an ongoing support group meeting monthly. She teaches sociology at City Tech and lives in Brooklyn with her spouse and two cats.



Maxine Schulof and her husband, Bob, have been members of the congregation since 2019. They found First Unitarian to be a place that resonates with their values of community, diversity, and humanitarian programs. Maxine has served the congregation in many different ways.
