Blessed is the transient flame we kindle here; Blessed is the illuminated moment of our gathering.



We are absolutely thrilled to welcome **Spencer LaJoye** to our service today as they tour their original music all over the Northeast — including a concert right here in our chapel last night as part of the Voices In the Heights concert series.

Spencer LaJoye is making queer indie folk music for everyone. They are a coast-to-coast singer/songwriter and vocal loop artist with Midwest roots, a classically-trained violinist with an inner theater kid's love of group choreography, and a student of Americana music with a theology degree hanging in their studio. Spencer has been touring their autobiographical folk songs for over a decade, but their viral 2021 anthem "Plowshare Prayer" secured them a permanent place in hearts and households across the world, as well as a peculiar career as a veracious songsmith with an unshakeable pastoral presence.

The Clara Barton Sisterhood: Universalist, Clara Barton, is best known for her work in organizing nursing services during the Civil War and, later, founding the American Red Cross. She did not start this work until she was over 40 — in an era when many women died before reaching that age. The UU Women's Federation created the Clara

Barton Sisterhood in her name to honor women aged 80 and over for their contributions to their congregations and communities.
